

## **Veranstaltung: Seminar zur Wirtschaftsgeographie (6LP)**

The idea is that the students identify the central question of their presentation and discuss it on the background of the related theoretical papers, elaborate the argument (with the help of further literature in economic geography, especially in recent journals in our library), and find suitable regional examples for the theoretical issues which contribute to each session (with feedback from Prof. Fuchs in the consultation hour). *The basic lecture is Mackinnon, D., Cumbers, A. 2011: An Introduction to Economic Geography. Globalization, Uneven Development and Place. Harlow, London.* Each of you will have to read the book completely. You can find the book in our library.

Your final mark will be derived from coursework that comprises

- Research paper (60% of the mark): Your research paper will be assessed on the basis of originality of research and intellectual ideas. You start your search with “your” chapter of the book, and then you identify a particular research problem and a related research question. You elaborate your research paper via search in the latest volumes in relevant economic geographical journals; you have to use and to cite at least 8 references of these journals in your research paper, i.e. in the list of your references (with related quotes in the paper).
